From One Minister to Another...

I remember my family's Sunday morning routine as we got ready for church. I wanted to be like the preacher, so I would put on a sport coat and clip-on tie. On the way to church, my mom would give me a stick of Wrigley's Doublemint gum and money from her purse for me to put in the offering plate. I loved putting money in the offering plate. I got to touch the plate, put in my coin or my dollar, and pass it to my neighbor. I remember feeling so happy when I participated in giving during worship.

When I asked my mom why we gave, she would tell me, "God has given us everything we have, so we have an opportunity to give back to God and help God's people." Long before my ordination and long before my baptism, my mom was teaching me—and I was putting into practice—how to give at church. There are so many beautiful and important ways to give, but the money my mom pulled out of her purse and gave me for the offering plate was my first lesson in Christian stewardship. It's a lesson I reflect on to this day.

There's a legend from the early church about an emperor who had all his troops baptized. These troops were told to keep their sword arm out of the water. All the rest of their bodies were baptized, but they felt they needed the arm they fought with to belong to the devil. They'd be fierce warriors, even if it meant they'd go to eternity with only one arm. They'd raise an arm above their heads in baptism, and give the rest of themselves to Jesus. A funny image, to be sure, but I wonder how often we attempt the same kind of thing.

"Give yourselves completely to God," James writes. Our baptism is immersive—it involves our whole selves: our "fighting arms," our feet, our minds, our hearts, our wallets and pocketbooks.

I don't get Doublemint gum or a quarter from my mom's purse before worship anymore. I give electronically now, and though our ushers don't stop at me when they're passing the offering plate, I still feel that giving—especially giving money—is one of the important and wonderful ways we're brought together in the Body of Christ.

This coming Sunday in worship, our Stewardship Committee will stand before the church to give an update on our giving. Unfortunately, the news they're tasked with sharing isn't good. Simply put: while our spending this year is within the church budget we approved last fall, it far exceeds our giving in a way that, frankly, isn't sustainable. This dire situation requires our attention, prayers, and generosity. I have assured Thank you for the delicious meal you our staff that First Baptist has a history of rising to the occasion and giving sacrificially when a challenge like this arises, and, as I pray, I have faith that we will do that again, with God's guidance and help. This is a time for us to remember that, just like my mom told me, "God has given us everything we have." I hope to see you Sunday as we thank God for those gifts.
