The Rejection of Jesus at Nazareth (6:1-6a)

- Jesus teaches in his hometown
- The people want to know how this carpenter son of Joseph has such wisdom
- This is a pivotal moment in Jesus' ministry
- Mark notes that he couldn't do any mighty work there, except for healing a few sick people



The Commission of the Twelve (6:6b-13)

- Jesus commissions the apostles and sends them out in pairs to do their work
 - Ministry is shared! Collaboration is important, support is needed, and we share the responsibility of the Great Commission with others.
 - The strengths of one person complement the weaknesses of another
- The apostles are given authority over unclean spirits and power to heal the sick



The Death of John the Baptist (6:14-29)

- Who we have here: Herod, Herodias, Salome
- Shows us the opposition Jesus was experiencing
- · Foreshadows Jesus' death
- "The cost of discipleship" and the courage required to be true to your calling



The Return of the Twelve (6:30-34)

- Jesus gives the apostles space to debrief, rest, and regroup
- The crowd finds them
- They are like "sheep without a shepherd" and Jesus takes pity on them. They are spirtitually and physically hungry
- "He began to teach them many things"
