## **Jesus' Challenge to False Views of Holiness** 7:1-37

- · Debate with the Pharisees about hand washing
- "There is nothing outside a person that by going in can defile, but the things that come out are what defile." (v 15)

- "He declared all foods clean" (v19)
- · Jesus' response to a Syrophoenician woman
- Travel through Gentile areas
- · Mark lays a foundation for the church's mission to the Gentiles

#### Jesus' Rejection of the Tradition of the Elders 7:1-23

- Motivation of the Pharisees and scribes
- Tradition and ritual purity
- · Jesus responds by quoting Isaiah
- Accuses the Pharisees of hypocrisy
- A revolutionary concept: it's not what's outside that defiles a person, but what comes from within



# The Wit and Faith of the Syrophoenician Woman 7:24-30

- A Syrophoenician woman's equest for healing
- Jesus' response: The children (referring to the Jews) should be fed first before giving the children's bread to the dogs (referring to the Gentiles)
- The woman's retort, with faith: "Even the dogs eat the crumbs"
- Jesus responds to her faith and heals her daughter

#### The Miracle of Healing for the Deaf

#### 7:31-37

- "They brought to him a deaf man with a speech impediment"
- "He took him aside in private"
- Jesus touched his ears and his tongue
- His ears were opened, his tongue was released
- Jesus brings comprehensive healing, spiritual and physical
- Healed hearing, understanding, speaking
