



### The Feeding of the 4,000 8:1-9

- No change of location; we are still in a Gentile area
- Parallels
- There is a problem
  - Lack of food (8:1)
  - Sheep without a shepherd (6:34)
- Jesus compassion (8:2; 6:34)

# The Lesson of the Leaven and the Loaves 8:14-21

- "Beware of the yeast of the Pharisees and the yeast of Herod"
- A recurring theme in Mark: the disciples just don't understand!
  - · This isn't about literal bread
  - This isn't about God's provision
- "Do you not yet understand?"



#### **Healing the Blind Man** 8:22-26

- Jesus leads the man out of the village. Why?
- Jesus' unique way of healing
- · A partial healing: "trees, walking
  - · What does it mean?
- The man's encounter with Jesus brings clarity, insight, illumination



#### Peter's Confession at Caesarea Philippi 8:27-30

- This passage is a transition point in Mark's story
- Who do people say that I am?
- But who do you say that I am?
- · Peter's bold confession
- Messianic secrecy: "Don't tell anybody"
- · Jesus shifts to a passion prediction



### The First Passion Prediction 8:31-33

- Jesus' prediction of his suffering and death serves as a reminder of the sacrificial nature of his mission
- Peter rebukes Jesus
- Jesus rebukes Peter
- Speaks about the ongoing battle between God's will and our expectations



# Teachings on Discipleship 8:34-38

- This is the essence of Christian discipleship
- A paradox
  - The transformative power of sacrificial love
  - The eternal rewards of faithful obedience
