There is an old *Peanuts* comic strip that came to mind as I sat down to write this (it was dated October 17, 1962- I looked it up). There are a lot of people doing a lot of things around here... and that is an "up" to see so much personal involvement.

I know (like Charlie Brown) that life has its ups and downs, that there are always challenges and disappointments, but it is important to celebrate the "ups" when they come. There have been a lot of "ups" lately... and I think there are more to come as we continue to move toward Easter. There are wonderful opportunities of worship and fellowship ahead that you don't want to miss in this special season (see related articles in this issue of *The Beacon* and mark your calendars).
